During the last 5 years she has been visited Moscow to work with them at their ice rink as well.

She is currently living and working in Turkey as Coach of Turkish Figure Skating National Team.

She is coaching among others, Estonian National Champion 2011, 15 years old Gerli Liinamäe. Gerli Liinamäe was 13th in European Championships 2011.



Ms Signe Valgemäe

Currently I am nearing the completion of my Master's studies of Physiotherapy in Tartu

University. I have been working as a physio for 6 years. Mainly specialized in rehabilitation and orthopedics. I'm also working as the off-ice coach for figure skaters and the Estonian National Sledge Hockey team.

I have attended various international figure skating summer camps as well as different ISU and Sledge Hockey Championships as the official physiotherapist of the Estonian teams.

I believe it is very important for a skater as well as to any other athlete to have a good posture. That includes strong core muscles that influence the balance of the whole body. My trainings are a combination of Pilates, gym and special physiotherapy exercises, which emphasize mainly on the core but also on other parts of the body. The main goal of my training is to obviate athletes from injuries through keeping their muscles in tone and their bodies in harmony and balance.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION FOR SKATERS, COACHES AS WELL AS PARENTS

The skaters have a possibility to take private lessons on **Pro-Motion Jumping Harness.** Russian figure skating coach **Sergei Dudakov**, will give private lessons during the summer camp. Mr Dudakov is working currently among others with such talented skaters as Julia Lipintskaya, Polina shelepen etc.

The big Rocca al Mare shopping centre is located in few minutes of walking from the ice rink.

We will have the following groups for the camp. We kindly ask you to choose your group and fill the box in registration form.

I: Junior and senior level skaters. This group works on triple/quard jumps, double/triple axel, spins, footwork.

II: Group for skaters, who can do at least 4 double jumps. This group works on all double jumps, double axel, spins and footwork.

III: Group for skaters who can do all single jumps. This group works on axel, practicing double jumps, spins and footwork.

IV: Group for beginners who have just started to skate. This group works on basic skating skills, spins, single jumps.

V: Group for an adult skaters. This group works on skating skills, spins, footwork, single/double jumps, axel. Adult group will be coached by Mrs Tiiu Valgemäe.

NB!!! ADULT SKATERS CAMP WILL BE HELD 11.06-23.06.2012!!!! There will be one ice time and one gym per day.Sunday,17.06.2012 is day off.

The fee of the International Figure Skating Summer Camp is:

€ 1200 for one week

€ 2200 for two weeks

€ 3000 for three weeks

€ 3700 for four weeks

€ 300 for adults skaters without accommondation and meals

Skaters will also be able to take private lessons with coaches participating in the camp. **Private lessons are subject for extra fee.**

On June 17, 24 and on July 01 the skaters will have the day off from training . Skaters should arrive on 10^{th} of June. Trainings will start on 11^{th} of June, Monday morning. Camp will end on July 08^{th} with breakfeast.

When the skater arrives to the hotel, she/he will get a broucher with all the information about the camp!
